
A traditional Greek folk song that has been passed down through

Is one of the most famous Greek instrumental pieces, composed by Manos Loizos in 1971. It is widely regarded as one of the greatest zeibekiko compositions in Greek music history.

Origin: The piece was written as part of the soundtrack for the Greek film "Eu δ o κ í α " (Evdokia), directed by Alexis Damianos. The film tells the tragic love story of a soldier and a young woman named Evdokia, set against the backdrop
